

# The Order for Mass for the External Solemnity of **ST GEORGE THE MARTYR, PATRON OF ENGLAND**

# 28<sup>th</sup> April 2024 at 6.00pm

Principal Celebrant and Preacher: the Lord Bishop of Fulham Welcome to St George's! This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Gregory Murray, New People's Mass.

At 6 o'clock the parish priest will come to the shrine of Our Lady to lead the singing of the Regina Caeli, the anthem of Our Lady for Easter. Please <u>stand</u>.

Spirit divine, recast our faulty ways, Make them ring true and echo to thy praise; Through every change of circumstance and choice May we confess thee with a single voice.

#### The bishop sings:

- *Bishop* In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- People Amen.
- *Bishop* Peace be with you.
- *People* **Peace be with you**.
- *Bishop* Alleluia, Christ is risen.
- People He is risen indeed! Alleluia.

The bishop introduces the Mass and invites the people to recall and confess their sins:

- *Bishop* As we give thanks for all those who from the beginning witnessed to Christ, even to the shedding of their blood, let us acknowledge our own faithlessness in following the way of our discipleship. So let us confess our sins.
- People I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.
- *Bishop* May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life,
- People Amen.
- People Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.Christ, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

We all sing the Gloria.

People Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the most high, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

### Then the bishop prays the collect:

Bishop God of hosts, who so kindled the fire of charity in the heart of Saint George your martyr, that he bore witness to the risen Lord both by his life and by his death; grant us through his intercession, we pray, the same faith and power of love, that we who rejoice in his triumph may be led to share with him in the fullness of the resurrection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Now <u>sit</u> to listen to the first reading:

*Reader* A reading from the Revelation to St John. (*Revelation 10; 10-12*).

I, John, heard a voice shout from heaven, 'Victory and power and empire for ever have been won by our God, and all authority for his Christ, now that the persecutor, who accused our brothers day and night before our God, has been brought down. They have triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the witness of their martyrdom, because even in the face of death they would not cling to life. Let the heavens rejoice and all who live there.' This is the word of the Lord.

### Remain seated for the second reading:

Reader A reading from St Paul's letter to the Romans. (Romans 5; 1-5) Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. This is the word of the Lord.

- *People* **Thanks be to God.**
- Stand for the gospel acclamation
- Choir Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
  People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
  Choir Happy the man who stands firm, for he has proved himself, and will win the crown of life.
- People Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
- *Priest* The Lord be with you,

- Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. (John 15; 18-21)
- People Glory to you, O Lord.
- *Priest* Jesus said to his disciples:

'If the world hates you, remember that it hated me before you. If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you do not belong to the world, because my choice withdrew you from the world, therefore the world hates you. Remember the words I said to you: A servant is not greater than his master. If they persecuted me, they will persecute you too; if they kept my word, they will keep yours as well. But it will be on my account that they will do all this, because they do not know the one who sent me.'
This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Please sit for the Homily from Bishop Jonathan.

All <u>stand</u> to say the Nicene Creed:

*People* I believe in one God, the Father almighty,

maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

*Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing the anthem "Ave Verum Corpus" by Sir Edward Elgar, while bread and wine are brought to the altar.* 

<u>Stand</u> to sing the hymn (REH 481), as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

The bishop says

- People May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.
- Bishop Receive, we pray, O Lord, the sacrifice of conciliation and praise, which we offer to your majesty in commemoration of the blessed Martyr Saint George, that it may lead us to forgiveness and confirm us in constant thanksgiving. Through Christ our Lord.
- People Amen.
- The bishop sings the opening of the Eucharistic Prayer:
- *Bishop* The Lord be with you.
- *People* And also with you.
- *Bishop* Lift up your hearts.
- *People* **We lift them up to the Lord.**
- *Bishop* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- *People* It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The bishop prays the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, and then all sing the Sanctus and Benedictus:

People Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
 Hosanna in the highest.

*Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution. Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:* 

- *Bishop* Great is the mystery of faith.
- People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.

The bishop concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing: People Amen!

# Please <u>stand</u> for the Lord's Prayer.

At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine
teaching, we dare to sing,
Our Father, who art in heaven
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come, thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;

#### Now sing the Agnus Dei

People Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us. (repeated)
 Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant us peace.

Then <u>kneel</u>.

- *Bishop* Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
- People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
- *Bishop* If we have died with Christ, we shall also live with him; if we persevere, we shall also reign with him, Alleluia.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn REH 396 is sung, all remaining <u>seated or kneeling</u>. O thou, who at thy Eucharist didst pray That all thy Church might be for ever one, Grant us at every Eucharist to say With longing heart and soul, 'Thy will be done.' O, may we all one Bread, one Body be, One through this Sacrament of unity.

For all thy Church, O Lord, we intercede; Make thou our sad divisions soon to cease; Draw us the nearer each to each, we plead, By drawing all to thee, O Prince of Peace: Thus may we all one Bread, one Body be, One through this Sacrament of unity. We pray thee too for wanderers from thy fold; O bring them back, good Shepherd of the sheep, Back to the faith which saints believed of old, Back to the Church which still that faith doth keep: Soon may we all one Bread, one Body be, One through this Sacrament of unity.

So, Lord, at length when sacraments shall cease, May we be one with all thy church above, One with thy saints in one unbroken peace, One with thy saints in one unbounded love: More blessèd still, in peace and love to be One with the Trinity in Unity. William Henry Turton (1856-1938)

All <u>stand</u> for the Post-Communion Prayer:

*Bishop* Rejoicing on this festival day, O Lord, we have received your heavenly gifts; grant, we pray, that we who in this divine banquet proclaim the death of your Son may merit with Saint George to be partakers in his resurrection and glory. Through Christ our Lord.

People Amen.

Please <u>sit for the notices</u>. After the notices St George's School Choir will sing.

Then <u>stand</u> for the blessing and dismissal

- *People* **Now and for ever.**
- *Bishop* Our help is in the name of the Lord.
- People Who made heaven and earth.
- *Bishop* May almighty God set his blessing upon you and defend you from every evil. And may he, who sustained his blessed martyr George in the bitter pains of his suffering, stretch forth the right hand of his mercy upon you: that,

in heaven above, you may rejoice in the companionship of him, whose triumphal victory you celebrate on earth.

All join in singing the National Anthem:

Clergy & servers go to the image of St George, which is censed: the bishop says: Bishop The love of Christ compels us to live not for ourselves

- *People* But for him who died and rose for us.
- *Priest* The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

- *Priest* Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.
- People Glory to you, O Lord.
- Priest Jesus said to his disciples: "I solemnly assure you, unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies, it produces much fruit. The man who loves his life loses it, while the man who hates his life in this world preserves it to life eternal. If anyone would serve me, let him follow me; where I am,

there will my servant be. Anyone who serves me, the Father will honour."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Remain standing to sing the hymn (REH 434) as clergy and servers depart:
