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Welcome to St George's! This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope you will find this service easy to follow, but please also do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an Induction Loop - sit away from the pillars for best results!

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles. Older children are invited to join the Children's Church.

A toilet is at the back of church behind the screen. After Mass, refreshments will be served in the Hall. Please join us! Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing the opening hymn (REH 147)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said: 'You yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and caused him to appear, not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will

appear with him in glory.

On the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going towards the tomb. Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth, which had been on the head of Jesus, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

At the end of the homily, a vessel of water blessed at the Easter Vigil is brought from the font, as music is played.

Then <u>stand</u> for the Renewal of Baptismal Vows.

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism. In baptism God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

People I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

People I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and

neighbour?

People I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

People I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

People I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth, and the life?

People I come to Christ.

*Priest* Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and

earth.

Priest Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was

conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Priest Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the

communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of

the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The priest sprinkles the people with blessed water, as the choir sings Vidi Aquam.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

The Priest introduces and concludes the prayers.

Priest Christ Jesus, the source of our hope, has been raised from the

dead. With thankful praise, let us offer these petitions.

Reader Lord, in your mercy or Reader Lord, hear us

People hear our prayer or People Lord, graciously hear us

At the prayer for the departed,

Reader Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord,

People and let light perpetual shine upon them.

When the prayers of the saints are asked for,

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

In conclusion to the prayers,

Priest Most merciful God, your loving plan of salvation finds its glorious

fulfilment in the resurrection of your son Jesus Christ. Extend that saving power throughout our lives and our world, this Easter Day

and every day. Merciful Father,

People Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus

Christ. Amen.

Please <u>sit</u>. Bread and wine are brought to the altar during which the choir sing "This Joyful Eastertide"; trad, arranged by Charles Wood (1866-1926).

Then stand to sing a hymn (REH 141), during which a collection is taken:

Who hath washed us in the tide Flowing from his piercèd side;
Praise we him whose love divine Gives the guests his blood for wine, Gives his body for the feast,
Love the victim, Love the priest.

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Memorial Acclamation,

*Priest* Great is the mystery of Faith.

People Thine be the glory, risen, conquering Son,

Endless is the victory thou o'er death hast won!

The Eucharistic Prayer concludes, and all sing,

Priest Through him and with him and in him,

People Amen!

*Priest* in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

People Amen!

Priest all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Please stand for the Lord's Prayer,

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to say,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

The people come forward to receive communion. If you have **not** been <u>baptised</u> and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of communion, carrying this Order of Service.

After communion the following hymns (REH 139 & 388) are sung, for which all remain seated or kneeling,
