This booklet contains all the material you will need for today's celebration of Mass. We hope that you will find this service easy to follow, but please do not be afraid to ask if you are unsure what to do at any point. The building is fitted with an induction loop and you will find the best results away from the pillars.

Families with small children are very welcome to make use of the carpeted play area at the back of church, where you will find books, crayons and soft toys. There are two further play stations in the side aisles. Older children are very welcome to join the Children's Church, who go out to the Hall shortly after the service has started, and return before Communion.

A toilet is at the back of church, behind the screen. After Mass, please join us in the hall for refreshments. Before Mass, please try to maintain an atmosphere of quiet prayer.

Mass setting: Heritage Mass.

Please <u>stand</u> when the bell rings, for the procession of the clergy and servers, and to sing hymn REH 149:

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Then the priest prays the collect:

Almighty ever-living God, constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us, that those you were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism may, under your protective care, bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Now sit to listen to the first reading:

Reader

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles. (Acts 14; 21-27). In those days: Paul and Barnabas returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, strengthening the souls of the

disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God. And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed. Then they passed through Pisidia and came to Pamphylia. And when they had spoken the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia, and from there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work that they had fulfilled. And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles.

This is the word of the Lord.

He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain any more, for the former things have passed away.' Stand for the gospel acclamation after a brief pause for reflection.

Priest The Lord be with you,

Priest A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. (John 13;

31-35)

All stand to say the Nicene Creed:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for

the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

Please <u>sit</u>, as the Choir sing "Fairest Lord Jesus" Silesian folk song, arranged by Martin How (1931-2022), and bread and wine are brought to the altar.

<u>Stand</u> to sing hymn REH 142, as the altar is prepared and the collection is taken. If you want to give by card, there is a card reader at the back of church.

The Priest says

Hosanna! Hosanna in the highest.

Please <u>kneel</u>. The Eucharistic Prayer continues, until the Words of Institution. Then all make the Memorial Acclamation:

Deacon Great is the mystery of faith.

People Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your cross and

resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and all sing:

People Amen! Amen! Amen!

Please <u>stand</u> for the Lord's Prayer.

Priest At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine

teaching, we dare to sing,

People Our Father, who art in heaven

hallowed be thy name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

*Priest* Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant

peace in our day, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour

Jesus Christ.

Now sing the Agnus Dei

us peace.

Then kneel.

Priest Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the

sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper

of the Lamb.

People Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my

roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

*Priest* I am the true vine and you are the branches, says the

Lord. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, bears fruit in

plenty, alleluia.

The people come forward to receive Communion. If you have not been baptized and confirmed, please come forward for a blessing instead of Communion, carrying this order of service.

During Communion hymn REH 399 is sung, all remaining seated or kneeling.

Soul of my Saviour, sanctify my breast, Body of Christ, be thou my saving guest, Blood of my Saviour, bathe me in thy tide, Wash me with water flowing from thy side.

Strength and protection may thy Passion be,

Then <u>stand</u> for the blessing and dismissal

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Priest The God of peace, who brought again from the dead our

Lord Jesus Christ, that great Shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which

is well-pleasing in his sight; and the blessing of God

almighty, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be

upon you and remain with you, always.

People Amen.

Priest Go forth, the Mass is ended.

People Thanks be to God.

Clergy and servers process to the Shrine of Our Lady to sing the Easter anthem to Our Lady, the Regina Caeli:

People Joy to thee, O Queen of Heaven, alleluia!

He whom thou wast meet to bear, alleluia!

As he promised hath arisen, alleluia! Pour for us to God thy prayer, alleluia!

Priest Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia!

People For the Lord is risen indeed, alleluia!

Priest Let us pray. O God, who by the resurrection of thy Son our

Lord Jesus Christ, didst vouchsafe to bring joy to the whole world; grant that, through the prayers of his mother, the Virgin Mary, we may obtain the joys of

everlasting life: through the same, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

People Amen.

Remain standing to sing hymn REH 143 as clergy and servers depart:
